Please do not sign any of the following initiatives as they ALL would have negative impacts on the health and safety of our communities.

- I-1068: concerns marijuana
- I-1072 concerns lowering the drinking age to 19
- I-1086 concerns ending the temporary excise tax on beer and strong beer
- I-1088 concerns reducing the tax on tobacco products
- I-1087 would end the temporary tax on certain carbonated beverages
- I-1089 would end a temporary increase in the business and occupation tax
- I-1090 concerns ending temporary taxes on bottled water and carbonated beverages
- I-1091 concerns ending temporary taxes on bottled water, carbonated beverages, and beer.
- I-1092 concerns ending tax increase enacted in 2010 on beverages and candy.
- I-1093 concerns ending temporary taxes on selling certain carbonated beverages and beer.
- I-1099 concerns closing state liquor stores and allowing beer and wine sellers and distributors to be licensed for spirits. (Privatize alcohol sales.)
- I-1100 concerns closing state liquor stores, privatize sale of spirits.
- I-1105 related to reforming state liquor sales. (Privatize alcohol sales.)
